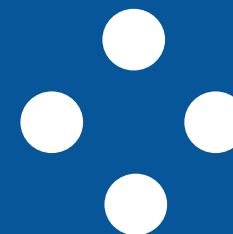

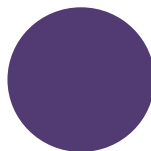

Return to in-person events

During 2022, the university community gradually returned to in-person activities. In the Piura and Lima campuses, necessary biosafety measures were implemented to safeguard the health of students and staff. Additionally, open spaces were designed and constructed to ensure distancing and compliance with all biosafety protocols.



Measures and changes implemented:

- ◆ The Laus application was implemented to monitor the health of the UDEP community on a daily basis. The platform enabled the control and surveillance of COVID-19.
- ◆ While the university community gradually reintegrated into in-person activities, virtual classes continued. Students only attended in-person classes for certain subjects during the first term of 2022-I.





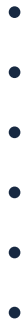

- ◆ A 6% reduction in student academic fees was maintained.

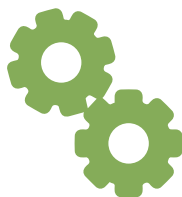
Social support

- ◆ In accordance with our pledge and responsibility towards the development and well-being of the region and the country, the university continued to serve as a vaccination center at the Piura Campus from January to August 2022, for a total of 99 days.









Infraestructure

To resume in-person classes, the university planned the execution of various infrastructure projects in both campuses in 2022. The objective was to provide the community with renewed and safer spaces for the development of academic, cultural, sports, and recreational activities.

Piura

- ◆ Three open-air classrooms (300 m² each) were constructed using tensioned canvas, with a capacity of up to 161 people each. These classrooms are equipped with modern technology and movable furniture.
- ◆ A student gathering point was implemented behind Building A, covering an area of approximately 250 m².
- ◆ The “Sports Zone Remodeling” project was executed, which involved the construction of two new sport courts to replace the old one, facilitating the practice of futsal, basketball, and volleyball.
- ◆ Two significant modifications were made to Blocks I and II. The University Chapel was relocated from the second floor to the first floor to increase accessibility and capacity. It was placed where classrooms 101 and 103 were located, and its current capacity is 132 people, a 45% increase compared to the previous one. Additionally, an independent block was constructed on the north side, housing the sacristy and offices for the Chaplaincy.
- ◆ In the last quarter of 2022, the intervention of the second and third levels of this area of the building began, while maintaining the current distribution of classrooms and offices.



Lima

- ◆ Two spacious and modern classrooms were constructed in Block O: one measuring 62.2 m² for 30 people, and another measuring 90.5 m² to place 54 students.
- ◆ A total of 322 m² of the A courtyard (Bellavista) was utilized to create three terraces, providing seating space for 70 students. This maximized the use of open space for individual and group study, leisure areas, a cafeteria, and more.
- ◆ The futsal court was expanded to provide a larger playing area.

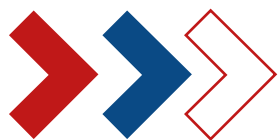
Moreover, several additional enhancements were implemented across both campuses. These included purchasing furniture for laboratories, libraries, classrooms, and administrative offices. The connectivity was also improved by extending WiFi coverage, enhancing lighting, and installing power outlets in common areas. Furthermore, significant upgrades were made to restroom facilities at key locations within the water networks.

After two years of remote study and work, academic and administrative activities gradually resumed in person at the university campuses in 2022. Thus, on February 21st, administrative and service staff who were still working remotely returned to their duties. The faculty members on March 1st and the students returned on the 21st of the same month.



Opening of the Academic Year

With excitement and joy, the Opening of the Academic Year 2022 took place in May. After two years, the traditional academic parade of graduates, master's degree holders, professors, and academic authorities was held, accompanied by the tune of "Gaudeamus Igitur."

Dr. Luis Castillo delivered the inaugural lecture titled "The Common Good and Freedom of Expression." He emphasized that the responsibility for the existence of a robust common good lies with the authorities. However, he clarified, "The management of the common good is not possible without the contribution of the citizens."

On May 6th, at the ceremony held at Lima Campus, 213 professionals from various fields graduated, and 37 obtained their master's degrees. To adhere to biosecurity protocols, family members of the graduates switched the tassel on the mortarboard, symbolizing their new status.

On May 13th, in Piura, 55 master's degree holders graduated, and 570 graduates were presented with the insignia symbolizing their degree. The in-person ceremony took place in the sports court.

In 2022, the in-person bachelor's degrees graduation ceremonies were also resumed in Piura and Lima. More than 2,500 graduates from the classes of 2019, 2020, and 2021 received the academic shash of bachelor's degree and celebrated the completion of their university studies.

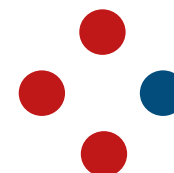
On May 10th and 11th, in Lima, over 1,500 graduates were conferred their degrees. A family member of each graduate awarded the academic shash to the graduates as a symbol of their new professional status.

On May 14th, nearly 1,000 graduates received the academic shash in Piura. Over three thousand individuals, including graduates, family members, and professors, attended the ceremony.

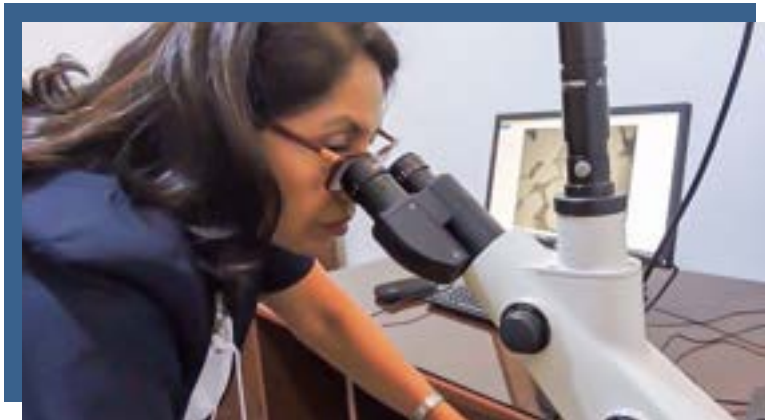

To date, the university has 188 doctors on its Piura and Lima campuses, 11 of them are professors at the PAD - School of Management.



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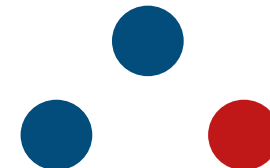


New postgraduate programs

Master's degree in Structural Integrity

On October 20th, the School of Engineering launched the first Master's degree in Structural Integrity in Peru, under the authority of Dr. Rosalba Guerrero.

The program is focused on the various procedures that ensure the proper functioning of assets or components in order to fulfil their intended lifespan.





Access to education

In 2022, more than 2,762 students with full and partial scholarships began their studies at UDEP, including 1,679 beneficiaries of the Programa Nacional de Becas y Crédito Educativo (Pronabec).

At the undergraduate level, the university welcomes students with scholarships such as Scholarship 18, Academic Excellence Scholarship, Academic Excellence Scholarship for Children of Teachers, Teaching Vocation Scholarship, School Talent Scholarship, School Sports Scholarship, and Women in Science Scholarship. Additionally, there are beneficiaries of the Sinersa Scholarship and BCP Patronato Scholarship.

Furthermore, this year, there were calls for new scholarships, such as Piura 450 Scholarship and Financial Leader Scholarship (Accounting).

Acreditation



The Mechanical-Electrical Engineering program at UDEP has received its physical certificate of international accreditation renewal from the Institute of Quality and Accreditation of Computing Programs, Engineering, and Technology (Icacit), obtained in 2020. The certificate is valid until 2024.

The international accreditation of the Mechanical-Electrical Engineering academic program represents an achievement for the university community and provides graduates with the opportunity to access greater benefits in the academic and professional spheres.

International Conference on Smart Agriculture

The Doctoral program in Engineering with a specialization in Automation, Control, and Process Optimization at the University of Piura (Peru), sponsored by the National Council of Science and Technology (Concytec), Prociencia, and the World Bank, organized this international conference.

The objective was to promote the application of methodologies and technologies in agriculture and agribusiness that enable the improvement of productivity and quality of their processes, cost reduction, and to illustrate the status of Agro 4.0 technology and the challenges for its implementation in Latin America. (From April 6th to 8th).



1st International Congress of Student Research in Business Administration (Ciade)

Under the motto "Business Management and Innovation: Contribution to Sustainable Development and Commitment to Stakeholders," the Business Administration academic program of the School of Economics and Business Sciences organized the Ciade conference. The purpose was to showcase the research and theses of those studying in the areas of Marketing, Innovation and Entrepreneurship, Human Resources, Finance, and Corporate Sustainability. (From May 19th to 21st).





2nd International Meeting on Communication: New Perspectives in Latin American Cinema

This gathering was an academic dissemination event, promoted and organized by the School of Communication. Professionals and researchers from various fields of Audiovisual Communication came together to analyze and discuss contemporary film works from Chile, Ecuador, Peru, Uruguay, and Colombia.

The focus was on exploring the new perspectives and emerging directors from each country with the aim of identifying commonalities and peculiarities in the cinemas of these countries, their trends, and the treatment of their film work produced in the first two decades of the 21st century. (May 21st).



International InnovaT Conference: Innovative Teaching in Higher Education

In Piura, this conference organized by the InnovaT project of Erasmus+ was held in a hybrid format. At Campus Lima, the project partners (universities from Austria, the Netherlands, Spain, Peru, and Chile) held a consortium meeting.

UDEP and eight universities from Europe and Chile participated in the event: Fh Joanneum Gesellschaft MBH (Austria); Universidad Católica San Pablo and Universidad de Lima (Peru); Universidad de Santiago de Chile, Universidad de Viña del Mar, and Universidad Austral de Chile (Chile); Universidad Carlos III de Madrid (Spain), and NHTV University of Applied Sciences (the Netherlands). (June 8th and 9th).



VIII International English Conference

The virtual conference “Applying new approaches in our changing ELT World,” organized by the Language Center, featured the participation of teachers from the United States, Costa Rica, Romania, Colombia, England, Ecuador, Mexico, Guatemala, Italy, and Peru.

It focused on new English teaching practices in the digital era, teaching landscapes in institutes from different parts of the world, and building a network of contacts among English language teachers worldwide. (July 1st and 2nd).



Health Activity 2022

The NGO Olive Branch Ministries International from Peru and the University of Piura organized this free medical campaign in Pedregal Grande (Catacaos). It involved 5 doctors, 3 nurses, and 10 American volunteers.

General medical care was provided, and approximately 300 children, adolescents, and elderly individuals were educated on public health topics. Olive Branch trained UDEP students on the project so that they, in turn, could train individuals at different age levels. (From July 18th to 22nd).





IV Reputation and Communication Conference

The event, called Educom 2022, was organized by the University of Navarra and the University of Piura. Its purpose was to reflect on the challenges faced by schools in empathizing with their audiences, finding ways to achieve greater unity among their administrators and teachers, the need to inspire trust in educational projects, and their management in a media-driven environment with applications and social networks.

The event took place in Lima and Piura. The sessions were led by Dr. Juan Narbona from the Pontifical University of the Holy Cross (Italy), and Dr. Fernando Huamán and Dr. Tomás Atarama from the School of Communication at UDEP. (July 7th and 9th).



3rd Latin American Congress of Architectural Research

The Department of Architecture organized the third edition of this congress (CLIA), which provided a space for reflection, exhibition, and research on architecture. It featured speakers from Spain, Chile, Argentina, and the United States.

The following topics were addressed: theory, design and technology, city and territory, history and built heritage, and architecture and landscape in the desert. (August 18th and 19th).



Workshop: Support Mechanisms and Promotion of Research Internationalization

The University of Piura organized this workshop with the aim of presenting the advancements on a new management model for scientific research in universities. This model is being developed within the framework of the Mimir Andino project, co-funded by the Erasmus+ program of the European Commission.

Mimir Andino is designed to assist and foster partner universities in South American countries to gain a better understanding of the status quo of their research management approaches. (September 27th).

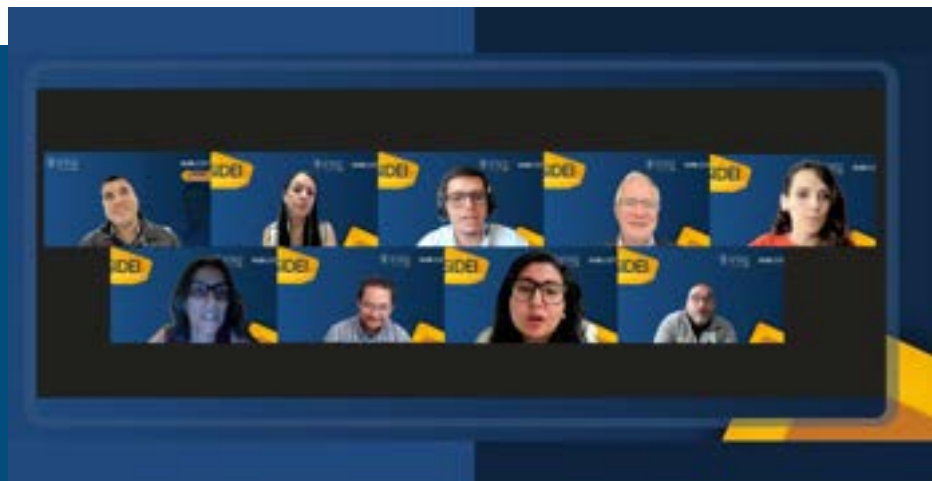
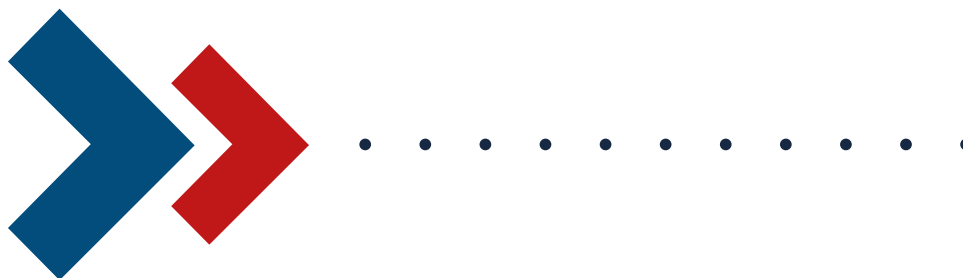


Regional Symposium on Conservation and Management of Documentary Heritage: Best Practices and Current Possibilities

The Central Library, the School of Humanities, and the Office of International Relations of the University of Piura, within the framework of the Erasmus+ project Codicis (financed by the European Commission), organized this symposium.

This event highlighted the importance of the conservation, management, and dissemination of documentary heritage (archival and bibliographic) through the presentation of experiences carried out in archives and libraries in Peru and around the world. (October 24th and 25th).





3rd International Seminar on Teaching Entrepreneurship and Innovation 2022

More than 100 university professors participated in this virtual seminar (Sidei), organized by the Innovation and Entrepreneurship Hub (UDEP HUB) and the School of Economics and Business Sciences.

The Sidei featured nine speakers from prestigious institutions such as TBS Business School (France), Universidad Carlos III of Madrid (Spain); the American University of El Cairo (Egipto); TEC of Monterrey (México) and the Universidad of Chile. (The seminar took place on November 10th and 11th).



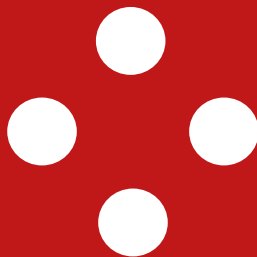
International Symposium “Social Dynamics, Categories, and Identities: The Northern Viceroyalty of Peru and Other Communities, 16th-18th Centuries”

The event was organized by the Department of History and Art of the School of Humanities, the Center for Humanities of Universidade Nova of Lisbon, and the Fundação para a Ciência e a Tecnologia of Portugal.

The symposium, held in a hybrid format, addressed topics related to social dynamics, interpersonal relationships, and socio-ethnic categories. (November 17th and 18th).

IV Summit on Innovation and Entrepreneurship (CiE 2022)

The fourth edition, held in a hybrid format by the Innovation and Entrepreneurship Hub (UDEP HUB), featured the participation of approximately 40 speakers, eight conferences, and seven panel discussions structured around six thematic areas related to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), including innovative startups, women entrepreneurs, regional ecosystems, technology transfer, investment, open innovation, academia, and international cooperation. (December 1st and 2nd).

In the meeting, organized by Propuestas del Bicentenario, Videnza, the Chamber of Commerce, and UDEP, the candidates presented plans and projects to tackle informality, citizen insecurity, and corruption.

The moderation responsibilities were undertaken by Milton Von Hesse, former minister of Agriculture and Housing. (September 19th and 20th).



Presentation of Project DER Results

As part of the Piura Innovadora strategy, the university presented the results of the Project for the Dynamization of the Regional Ecosystem of Research, Innovation, and Entrepreneurship of Piura (DER Piura), aiming to promote the social, economic, and scientific development of the Piura region.

UDEP led the project's execution in collaboration with the National University of Piura, the Regional Government of Piura, and the Chamber of Commerce and Production of Piura. It was co-funded by Proinnóvate and the Caja Municipal de Ahorro y Créditos de Piura. (October 7th).



CADE 2022: Promoting Regional Development

The Annual Conference of Executives (CADE) 2022 took place in Paracas, as well as simultaneously in Arequipa, Trujillo, and Piura. In the latter, various specialists gathered at UDEP to tackle the current economic situation in Peru, propose alternatives to foster productive activities such as agriculture and mining, and promote formal employment to avoid a recession in 2023.

Juan José Díaz, then mayor of Piura, and the president of the Chamber of Commerce of Piura, Javier Bereche, provided information on the region's economic situation and presented some proposals to prevent a recession. (November 11th).



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Contests

International Chinese Bridge Competition

With the theme "One world, one family," the competition, organized by the Confucius Institute, aimed to promote and spread the Chinese language and culture in Peru.

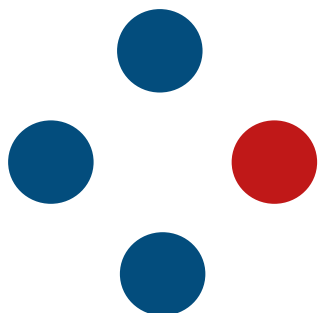




“Cultura es +” School Contest

NEW agreements



In 2022, the University of Piura signed 49 agreements, 24 of which are new international agreements with institutions such as the Universidad Politécnica de Madrid, Universidad Distrital Francisco José de Caldas (UDFJC - Colombia), University of Applied Sciences (Netherlands), Capital Normal University (China), the Center for Entrepreneurship at IAE Business School (Argentina), among others.



Introduction of the Double Bachelor's Degree Program UDEP - De Montfort University

UDEP entered into an agreement with De Montfort University of Leicester, United Kingdom, which allows students in Business Administration and Mechanical-Electrical Engineering to obtain a double bachelor's degree from both universities.

To achieve this, students must meet certain requirements, such as proficiency in English to understand and express themselves effectively during their degree studies in the UK. Additionally, they must have completed four and a half years at UDEP, continue with one year of studies in the United Kingdom, and obtain their degrees in each country.



Articulation Agreement with the University of Northern Iowa

The University of Northern Iowa signed an agreement with UDEP that enables students and graduates to pursue the Master of Science in Technology with an emphasis in Technology Management in Iowa.

Students who meet the requirements to start the graduate program, with credit validation from their undergraduate studies, can complete the master's degree in just three semesters. Moreover, the program offers the possibility of taking the first semester online.





International projects



With the aim of improving academic management and innovation, the university develops projects in collaboration with international institutions. Academic Mobility

In-person exchanges resumed in 2022. Forty-five professors attended seminars, courses, workshops, trainings, and conferences in Germany, Chile, Mexico, Spain, Brazil, Colombia, Portugal, Pennsylvania, England, among other countries.

Additionally, 49 foreign professors participated in the academic activities carried out by the university, both face to face and online scenarios.

Thanks to the UDEP International department, students continued to experience the exchange program. At the UDEP International Expo 2022, students and alumni learned about education systems in the Americas, Asia, and Europe, as well as different internationalization opportunities, including undergraduate and graduate studies, and pre-professional internships.

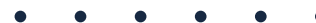

Some of the completed projects are as follows:

- ◆ **Development of a sustainable carob forest management model based on climatic, soil, and ontogenic characteristics of dry forest populations in Piura. (School of Engineering).**

Objective: to evaluate fruit dehydration processes technologies used in the region; design and build a dehydrator prototype using controlled instant decompression technology and microwave.

- ◆ **Design and manufacture of construction pieces from the valorization of plastic waste from banana cultivation for the rural sector of the Piura region. (School of Engineering).**

Objective: to contribute to solving environmental problems by using harmful plastic waste for plants and animals; reduce the carbon footprint by decreasing the requirement for resins to manufacture plastic; and reduce the amount of carbon emitted into wood-burning stoves by producing conventional bricks.

- ◆ **The ecclesiastical council of Lima and its relations with the State in the early years of the Republic of Peru (1821-1835). (Faculty of Law). (School of Law).**

Objective: to analyze the relations between the Church and the State during the early years of the republican period in Peru.

R&D&i projects with external funding



In 2022, Instituto de Ciencias para la Familia, the Directorate of Innovation, the Vice-President of Research, the High Management Program (PAD), and the School of Engineering, Human Medicine, Education Sciences, and Law developed **56 R&D&i projects**, thanks to external financing. Among them, the following were presented:

Dynamization of the Regional Ecosystem for Research, Innovation, and Entrepreneurship in Piura (DER Piura)

- ◆ The DER Piura project, already completed, under the responsibility of the Innovation Department of UDEP, focuses on automation technologies, ICT for process efficiency and optimization, and industrial process efficiency.

Characterization of the process of human influence on a territory with ancestral roots in the Tamboya Valley (Yamango district, Morropón province, Piura region).

- ◆ The objective of this project, executed by the Vice-President of Research, is to carry out a comprehensive study of the human processes that have occurred in the valley, from ancient times, in order to determine the characteristics of this heritage landscape.



Innovation for the competitiveness of the agro-industrial granulated panela chain in the Piura region

- ◆ As part of this project, the Instituto de Ciencias para la Familia developed the manual “Valuing and Working Together: Gender Equity in Social Projects.” It compiles the content of the workshops conducted on gender equity, which have benefited 350 residents of the mountain region of Piura.

Gen Z is Watching Us: A Psychosocial Study on Urban Peruvians from Socioeconomic Segments C and D, Aged 19 to 27

- ◆ The High Management Program (PAD) of the University of Piura carried out this project, which focuses on sustainability and ESG indicators (Environmental, Social, and Governance) as research lines.





Numerical-Experimental Study for the Generation of Clean and High-Efficiency Energy using Biomass and Coal Solid Waste through Primary Thermal Monitoring Measurements and Combustion Diagnostics

- ◆ This project, carried out by the School of Engineering, discusses energy efficiency and renewable energies as part of its research lines, as well as the phenomenology of fluid flow.

In vitro determination of novel therapeutic targets in cellular models of non-small cell lung cancer positive for anaplastic lymphoma kinase (ALK) gene mutation.

- ◆ Carried out by the School of Human Medicine, this project encompasses the trends and determinants of indicators of healthcare strategies in Peru.

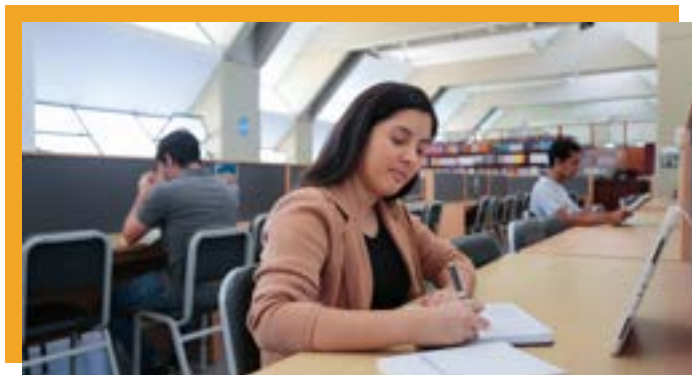
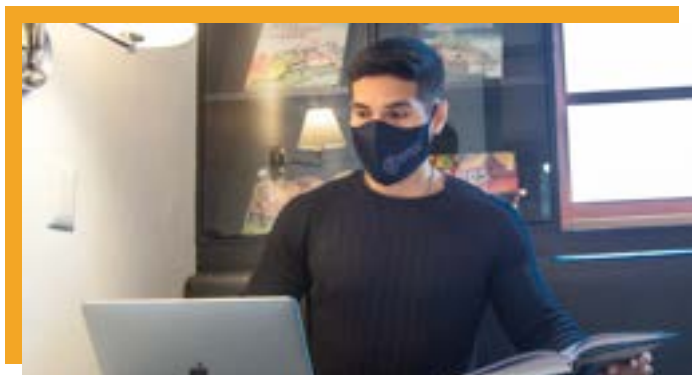

- ◆ Published by the School of Law since 2000, this specialized legal publication aims to promote the development of legal studies in various branches of law by fostering analysis, research, and legal discussion.

In 2022, the 23rd volume of the journal was published. Currently, its articles are available in HTML, PDF, and Word formats, ready for download.



Book titles and purchases

- ◆ In 2022, the bibliographic collection of the University of Piura expanded to 154,280 titles. This year, 6,802 new books were acquired for Lima and Piura.

Currently, the department has 11 databases available: Dialnet, Jstor, Passport America, Multilegis, Westlaw, UpToDate, Ebsco Host, Clinical Key, Psycodoc, Visible Body and Apa Psycbooks.

Library Projects

- ◆ The Library (Piura and Lima) participated in six projects, including the corrections in the Alma platform, implemented by the university to continue providing the academic tools for the university community to achieve excellent comprehensive education and foster scientific research in all areas. Additionally, it developed macro processes, questionnaires, and inventories of the Library System.

Pirhua Repository

- ◆ In this repository, a total of 328 theses were registered. Among them, 293 are undergraduate and postgraduate theses from different schools, 10 are from the Instituto de Ciencias para la Familia (ICF), and 25 are from the PAD-School of Management.

The University of Piura has a wide variety of contents in its publications. Its professors and researchers strive to promote innovation and contribute to the country's development through theses, projects, and publications in general.

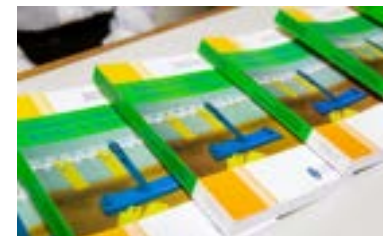

VOLUNTEERISM AND **society**



Volunteering activities contribute to the comprehensive development of our students and, at the same time, demonstrate and validate the value and abilities they can contribute to the community. In 2022, **620 students** from Piura and Lima participated in the volunteer programs organized by the Vida Universitaria area, which promotes social activities in both assistive and professional levels.

In Lima, Univas, Yachay Wasi, and Woman in Engineer (WIE) conducted workshops and activities aimed at children and adults. Univas focused on psychomotor skills development for children aged 4 to 5 years old, and provided informative talks to parents and service personnel from institutions such as Cuna Jardín Armatambo and the Hospital San Bartolomé. WIE, on the other hand, taught the fundamentals of robotics to children from Silva Brígida School through robot assembly.

They also provided psychological assistance and emotional support to various communities. They supported the dissemination of the “Ponle Corazón” campaign against cancer, and collected books for the I.E. 140 school in Santa Cruz Villacuri through projects such as

Dando+, Solidariamente, Una Carta, Dos Corazones, Andar, and Ponle Corazón.

Through activities such as Semana Univas, the Dessert Fair, and Festi-UDEP, members of the different volunteer programs raised funds to support these projects, help the Hospital San Bartolomé, and complete the construction of the San Josemaría parish in Pachacútec.





In Piura, the members of “Minka Piru” and “Cuenta un cuento desde casa” assisted more than 300 children from Miguel Cortés, Manuel Scorza, and Madre del Redentor schools with academic reinforcement and promoting reading. They also taught composting techniques to children from Fe y Alegría school.

Other organizations such as “Cima UDEP,” “IEEE,” “WYA UDEP,” and “Una Carta, dos corazones” worked with the university community, providing training to students on sustainability topics and delivering letters of gratitude and recognition to teachers and students. Univas, “CIMA UDEP,” “Mensajeros de la esperanza,” “Jóvenes por el Perú,” “Por Piura,” and other volunteer groups raised funds and provided support in the districts of Bernal, Lalaquiz, Pedregal, and Cura Mori.

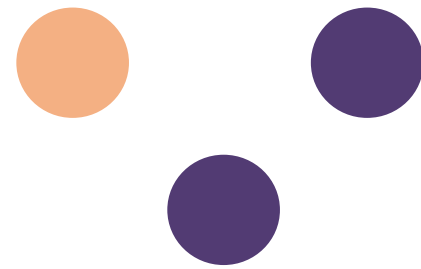

Sonqo Psychological Care Center

Sonqo provided individual and group therapy to **50 patients**, offering psychological and psychiatric support. The most common reasons for seeking therapy were mood disorders, anxiety disorders, and related issues.

In addition to therapy sessions, Sonqo organized talks and events at both national and international levels for students enrolled in the Psychology academic program.

- ◆ 59 hours of seminars led by professors in Peru, Argentina, and Spain.
- ◆ In collaboration with the University of Los Andes (Chile), the Pan-American University (Mexico), the Austral University (Argentina), and the University of La Sabana (Colombia), the second edition of the International Rotation program was conducted. Two UDEP students participated in this program.
- ◆ Six female students graduated from the Psychological Approaches program, a training project within the Psychology Program aimed at strengthening graduates' knowledge and psychotherapeutic skills, as well as providing them with the necessary tools for patient support and care.
- ◆ In July and November, Sonqo provided training and workshops to 21 students and 24 teachers in Early Childhood Education and Primary Education.
- ◆ Additionally, Sonqo offered 160 hours of support and workshops to the Bulimia and Anorexia Self-Help Group (GABA).



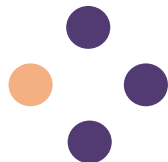
“Los Algarrobos” Legal Clinic

The legal clinic of the Law School provided legal advice and assistance to individuals seeking fair defense of their rights. In 2022, they handled **over 300 legal consultations and 73 ongoing legal cases.**

The cases involved the following areas:

- ◆ **Family Law:** child support, child custody, inheritance, adoption, support and safeguards, visitation rights, and domestic violence.
- ◆ **Civil Law:** evictions, property claims, acquisitive prescription of ownership and leases.
- ◆ **Administrative Law:** defense procedures for rights in defense of different public administrations.

Additionally, they provided virtual and in-person legal consultations to individuals. Each case was analyzed to answer questions, resolve doubts, and recommend possible legal options.



2022 Campodónico award: Vidawasi Perú

The Vidawasi Association received the Campodónico 2022 Award in the province of Urubamba (Cusco).

During the ceremony, Robert Moniot, vice president of the Clover Foundation, presented the \$50,000 check. José Ricardo Stok, on behalf of the UDEP rector, and Antonio Mabres, president of the Advisory Council of the award, offered he winners' diploma and medal to Vidawasi's founders, Jesús Dongo and his wife, Marina Cano.

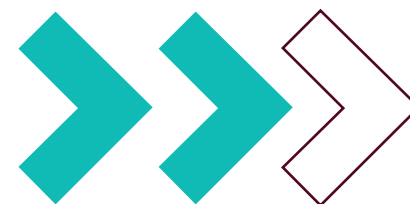


Ramón Mugica Olympics

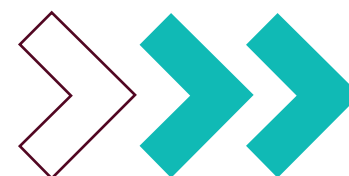

UDEP Healthy

In September, the **8th Health, Nutrition, and Sports** Fair was held in Piura, aiming to promote healthy lifestyle habits and environmental care. It was organized by UDEP Healthy Center, from the Department of Biomedical Sciences, in cooperation with Vida Universitaria -Piura and the Office of Human Talent Development Management.

Medical staff from the University Polyclinic provided the university community with services such as nutritional counseling, hypertension screening, body mass index (BMI) measurement, optometry consultations, and anti-stress massages.

There were also sports activities, including a Tai Chi session conducted by the Confucius Institute, a Zumba class offered by the Fit Body gym, and a performance by the UDEP dance team.

In the Piura and Lima campuses, other health campaigns, educational talks, clinical analyses, and examinations were carried out.

In Piura, three editions of the Open Week were held, with the total participation of over 1600 high school students in their fourth and fifth year. They had the opportunity to experience each academic program offered by UDEP through in-person workshops.

Additionally, competitions were organized for students in 3rd, 4th, and 5th year of high school, such as “Say No to Bullying,” “Graphics for Connection,” “Culture+,” “Heritage Solutions,” among others.

In addition, the first campaign with an influencer, Gonzalo Torres, was also carried out. Four short videos in reel format and one photo were published on social media platforms to promote UDEP. In total, the campaign reached 90,806 views, 5,882 likes, and 1,810 shares. The photo received 4,663 likes.
